Grow or Die

1.15 - When interviewing new employees, Travis Kalanick asks them if they are assholes. *What kind of characteristics do you think he is looking for in new **recruits**?*

11.11 - During his meeting with Bill, Travis is reluctant to give the deserved credit to his co-founder, Garrett. He says, "And Garrett contributed a lot, too. Absolutely." In fact, Garrett contributed a lot more than "a lot."

What does this say about Travis' personality? Does Travis give his co-founder the deserved credit?

12.28 - One of the questions Bill asks during his meeting with Travis is about the **stickiness** of Uber.

*Could you name a product that is also **sticky**? How about a company that has disrupted an industry? Should we invest in companies or founders?*



15.00 - In the limo, Travis tells Bill the story about his first company.

How would you describe what happened there? Why did he fail?

19.58 - When Travis and his brother visit their parents, they both brag about their achievements.

*Whose accomplishment do you think is more impressive for a parent: Travis's, who just **cut** a big **deal** to **bankroll** his company, or his brother's **body cam** footage of saving a cat? His father asks for the clip, because he wants to show it to his co-workers at work.*



23.04 - The head of the Transportation Agency of San Francisco has a little chat with Travis about fines, lawsuits, and jail.



What does he want from Travis? Why does Travis compare Neanderthals to Homo sapiens during the conversation?

25.21 - Uber receives an order to **cease** and **desist** all taxi and livery operations, because according to the city, they are violating the law. If Travis continues operations, he could face huge fines, penalties, and even jail time.



We all know how Travis reacts to this. He calls it his birth certificate. What would an average CEO's reaction be in a similar predicament? Wouldn't a ban like this be a death certificate for them? What does it say about Travis?

29.24 - Austin, the girl who is responsible for recruiting or hiring drivers, says that the drivers make themselves **rodents** that run like




hamsters in a wheel and work so hard to pay off their loans.
